- **GIRLS ON THE RUN - We Need Coaches for an After-School Program Just for Girls!** Using the power of running and being active, girls learn important life skills such as teamwork, leadership, goal-setting, conflict resolution and healthy decision making. Starting in February, girls can again participate in the exciting Girls on the Run program at Liberty Elementary. Girls on the Run is a fun after-school program for 3rd-5th grade girls that meets two times per week for 10 weeks. Each session is 90 minutes long. At the end of the program, all girls participate in a non-competitive 5K (3.1 mile) run/walk event on December 2nd as a final personal challenge for the season. Many girls unable to run one lap at the beginning of the program are prepared for the season finale at the end. With sweat, tears, smiles and many proud moments, the girls endure more than they ever imagined possible providing them with confidence and self-esteem when faced with challenges growing up. **We need your help to make this happen at our school in the spring.** Girls on the Run coaches are essential for making the program a success. To that end, Girls on the Run Sonoma County provides online and in-person training, CPR/First Aid certification, the curriculum and all materials, and all the support you will need to make your team a success.
