# GOAL Goal 2A: AMAO 1 -Annual Progress Learning English

The consortium met the AMAO 1 target and will continue to do so by increasing the percentage of English learners that will attain English language proficiency so that by June of 2015 the percentage of English learners learning English will increase to at least attain 59% in order to move toward state defined growth expectations as measured by CELDT/ELPAC.

#### GOAL Goal 2B: AMAO 2 - English Proficiency

The consortium met both AMAO 2 targets and will continue to do so by increasing the percentage of English learners that will attain English language proficiency annually. • By June of 2015 the percentage of English learners in language instruction educational programs fewer than 5 years will increase to at least attain 22.8% in order to move toward state defined growth expectations as measured by CELDT/ELPAC. • By June 2015, the percentage of English learners in language instruction educational programs 5 or more years will increase to at least 49%, in order move toward state-defined expectations as measured by CELDT/ELPAC.
